



Youth Trip Code of Conduct | Faith & Future Utah Youth Trip

Trip Dates: April 2–5, 2026

Locations: Utah (Salt Lake City, Provo, Orem)

Organization: Gathering of Tribes

To help create a safe, respectful, and meaningful experience for everyone, all youth are expected to follow the guidelines below throughout the trip.

1. Respect & Kindness

- Treat everyone with kindness, respect, and courtesy — fellow youth, leaders, speakers, and the public.
 - Bullying, teasing, gossip, or disrespectful language or behavior will not be tolerated.
 - Be inclusive, supportive, and uplifting to others.

2. Follow Leaders & Group Expectations

- Follow the directions of trip leaders at all times.
 - Stay with your assigned group and never wander off alone.
 - Rule of Three: Youth must remain in groups of at least three at all times — no pairing off.
 - Be on time and prepared for all scheduled activities.

3. Honor Sacred Spaces

- Show reverence during General Conference, on temple grounds, and at sacred cultural or conservation sites.
 - Dress and behave appropriately in all sacred and public settings.
 - Help maintain a respectful and spiritual environment for everyone.

4. Safety First

- Follow all safety rules and guidelines.
 - Do not leave the group without permission from a leader.
 - Remain in a group of three at all times.
 - Immediately report any injury, concern, or uncomfortable situation to a leader.

5. Technology & Media Use

- This trip includes a Digital Detox — personal phones and devices will not be used.
 - Youth may bring and use a stand-alone camera.
 - Always respect others' privacy and be mindful when taking photos, especially in sacred or cultural spaces.

6. Dress & Appearance

- Wear comfortable, modest clothing suitable for activities.
- Clothing should be free of offensive wording, explicit images, or inappropriate messages.
- No clothing that promotes drugs, alcohol, violence, or profanity.
- When in doubt, choose something respectful and simple.

- For Temple & General Conference: Sunday dress. We also encourage youth to wear cultural clothing during conference (such as ribbon shirts or skirts). We love seeing youth proudly represent their culture.
 - For Daily Activities: Comfortable, modest clothing and walking shoes

7. Substance-Free Commitment

- The use or possession of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, vaping products, or any inappropriate substances is strictly prohibited.
 - All prescription medications must be turned in and managed by leaders according to trip medical guidelines.

8. Property & Belongings

- Respect hotels, buses, venues, and the personal belongings of others.
 - Youth and families may be held financially responsible for damages caused by misuse or neglect.

9. Spiritual & Personal Responsibility

- Participate fully and respectfully in all planned activities.
 - Make choices that reflect personal integrity, cultural pride, and faith values.
 - This trip is an opportunity to grow spiritually, build leadership skills, and strengthen connections.

10. Accountability

- Failure to follow this Code of Conduct may result in consequences, including:
 - Loss of privileges
 - Parent/guardian notification
 - Being sent home early at the family's expense
